NASSAU VILLAGE — Plans for next summer are already underway for Nassau Villagers. "A place near home" has been procured for next summer's vacationers.

A five-acre site between Swarthmore avenue and Acres Drive in Ridley Township, is the location for the 75x100 foot swimming pool to be built for the Nassau Swim Club. A wading pool will be furnished for the small children.

A contract bid for building the parking area, with a capacity for 100 parked cars, a cabana containing showers and dressing rooms, shuffleboard and volley-

was awarded to the Fisher Construction Co. The Viking-Paddock Pool Inc. was awarded the contract to build the pools.

A competent pool manager will be placed in charge of the pool and grounds, will supervise lifeguards, and will be responsible for maintaining the necessary health and safety requirements.

According to membership chairman, Edward M. Cavanaugh, applications for membership have been circulated throughout the 6th Ward.

The first 50 applicants, officially not required to pay the \$50 initiation fee, and more than 100 other families already have joined the

The purchase of a bond for family membership at the cost of \$325 is limited to 350 families.

Cavanaugh said that "memberships are being filled rapidly. For those interested, information is available at our office, which is located in the basement of the home of William Tarr, 218 Hoffman Rd., Nassau Village, from 1 to 3 and 7 to 10 p.m.

Every effort is being made to proceed quickly, with expectations of opening the pool by May 31, 1961. The actual date of opening depends upon the cooperation concerning membership applications.
